

MAJOR INITIATIVES



To fund the implementation and evaluation of eight multi-sector community collaboratives working to increase the number of Kansas fourth graders proficient in reading that aligns with the Kansas State Department of Education's statewide early literacy strategy.



DOUBLE UP FOOD BUCKS EXPANSION

\$1,925,000

To expand the existing Double Up Food Bucks program across Kansas and leverage additional federal and local dollars to incentivize more SNAP recipients to affordably purchase fruits and vegetables at farmers markets and grocery stores across the state.

TOBACCO TREATMENT AND RECOVERY IN THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SYSTEM PHASE II

\$1,122,000

To build upon current momentum within the behavioral health system to implement organizational and systems changes designed to reduce tobacco use among individuals with mental health issues and conduct an evaluation of initiative outcomes.

KANSAS FOOD POLICY PROJECT— KANSAS ALLIANCE FOR WELLNESS \$824,722

Strengthen access to healthy foods efforts across the state by continuing to build the capacity of local food policy councils to advocate for improved food and beverage environments and to evaluate impact.

ENGAGING IN EDUCATION \$750,000

Create a distribution and engagement strategy for a reading handbook targeted to lower household income parents in Southwest Kansas for them to build an understanding of the importance of early childhood literacy and improve reading skills for young children.

Create a statewide awareness campaign conveying the importance of Census participation and the connection between population data and funding for resources in Kansas.

STRENGTHENING LOCAL SAFETY NETS

\$440,000

To increase access to care by supporting Kansas safety net providers to shift models to address chronic and emerging challenges in part by utilizing federal funding opportunities and developing competitive grant proposals to address health needs in communities.

GRANT WRITING ASSISTANCE TO KANSAS NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

\$299,312

To extend the collaborative efforts of the six Kansas health foundations to support the ongoing work of the Alliance for a Healthy Kansas coalition, advocating at the state and federal level for affordable healthcare for Kansans.

COVER KANSAS CERTIFIED APPLICATION COUNSELORS (CAC) \$82,500

Connect low-income Kansans to health insurance coverage through Certified Application Counselor positions in up to eight locations around the state.

Increase Enrollment Specialist availability from part-time to full-time and hold four education community forums to offer guidance and expand insurance enrollment for Latino families in Wyandotte and Johnson counties.

Purchase and implement updated server capabilities to increase client access, improve efficiency and expand services to low-income residents in all areas of Kansas, specifically southern and western rural Kansas.

Develop and implement a marketing and communication strategy to increase awareness of public health department programs and services for residents of Riley County.

ALTERNATIVE MEAL CHOICES FOR THE ELDERLY \$25,000

Expand the RSVP Freezer Meal program and collaborate with the Marshall County Agency on Aging to eliminate gaps in service and provide low-income seniors with access to healthy food in Marshall County.

AQUAPONICS IN SOUTHEAST KANSAS: A SUSTAINABLE PRODUCTION SOLUTION TO FOOD INSECURITY \$25,000

Create an aquaponics operation to provide sustainable food production of fish and produce through a partnership between Pittsburg State University and USD 246 for residents within the food desert communities of Crawford County.

BACKSNACK AND SCHOOL PANTRY \$25,000

Expand programming to five additional schools to provide food-insecure children and their families in northeast Kansas access to nutritious meals, snacks, produce and food staples when school programs are unavailable.

BETHEL YOUTH ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

\$25,000

Implement a new transitional program that teaches healthy lifestyles, nutrition, disease prevention, and cultural social skills and provides meals and transportation to low-income, immigrant students in Wyandotte County.


CAPACITY BUILDING FOR SPECIAL OLYMPICS KANSAS

\$25,000

Implement leadership and advocacy training for staff and volunteers and collaborate with other partners to improve access to care and provide education regarding healthy behaviors for individuals with intellectual disabilities throughout the state of Kansas.

➤ CELEBRATING THE CENTENNIAL OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT—WOMEN VOTE: LEARNING FROM THE PAST, IMAGINING THE FUTURE \$25,000

Design and implement a series of voter engagement activities around the centennial anniversary of the 19th Amendment focused on increasing civic participation among young people of color and low-income, high-percentage minority communities.



CLIENT CHOICE FOOD PANTRY \$25,000

Create a Choice Food Pantry that increases access to healthy foods for low-income populations and increases staff and volunteer interaction with clients to help with personal, healthier food choices and meal planning in Wichita and Sedgwick County.



CLUBHOUSE HEALTH & FITNESS \$25,000

Provide nutrition education classes, healthy foods snack shop, physical activity opportunities and commit to becoming a smoke-free facility to reduce health complications and elevate quality of life for consumers in Shawnee County.



COMMUNITY HEALTH AND ENGAGEMENT

\$25,000

Onboarding a Community Health Worker to increase capacity of staff to better understand and resolve barriers that underserved Barber County community members face in accessing health care.

CONNECTING CONSTITUENTS \$25,000

Enhance communication strategies by rebranding, creating resources in Spanish and building awareness to improve access to services for targeted populations, especially Hispanic communities, in Shawnee County, KS.

CORE CIRCLES EXPANSION— YOUTH CORE MINISTRIES

\$25,000

Strengthen infrastructure by implementing a new secure portal and hiring an administrative coordinator to expand Core Circles programming to families below the 200% poverty level in five new communities: Atwood, Goodland, Meade, Herington, and Harper.

CREATING A STRONGER BEHAVIORAL HEALTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PLAN

\$25,000

Create a resource guide outlining a financially sustainable behavioral health staffing model that includes reimbursement coding options health care organizations can use in their efforts to build a stronger behavioral health workforce and increase access to care.

DOLLY PARTON IMAGINATION LIBRARY PROGRAM OF RENO COUNTY (DPIL)

\$25,000

Expand reach of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program of Reno County beyond Hutchinson into nine rural communities to increase reading levels and kindergarten readiness.



DOUGLAS COUNTY STRATEGIC EMPOWERMENT PROPOSAL \$25,000

Develop and implement an intensive strategic plan focused on fostering deep relational grassroots advocacy networks that advance civic participation to increase access to care, educational opportunities and transportation in Douglas County.

For the KU School of Medicine, Pediatrics Division to create a social marketing campaign to educate pregnant women most at risk of smoking in Sedgwick County regarding the link between smoking and sleep-related infant deaths.

Provide matching funds to establish and implement the efforts of a community collaborative that will ensure full funding for the local Dolly Parton Imagination Library satellite and the participation of all local libraries in the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program.

EXPANDING ACCESS IN SEDGWICK COUNTY \$25,000

Upgrade Project Access software system to expand data capacity, enhance user-friendliness, interface with the Internet, communicate with providers and other stakeholders, and diversify revenue to support medically uninsured adults with serious health conditions.

To expand communications and outreach strategies to improve access to care for underserved adults with developmental disabilities into Butler County.

Certification for an RN as a Diabetic Educator to create and implement a Diabetes Self-Management Education Program designed to positively impact the increasing diabetes rates in Harper and surrounding counties.



GROWING OUR REACH INTO THE COMMUNITY

Contract with an advertising agency to develop online engagement and donor development to build financial sustainability and increase volume and variety of nutritious produce for food-insecure families, children, and seniors in Northeastern Kansas.

HEALTHCARE AS A HUMAN RIGHT: PEOPLE'S HEALTHCARE BILL **ACTION PROJECT**

\$25,000

Organize and coordinate community and state-wide actions supportive of Medicaid Expansion and other elements of the People's Healthcare Bill for low-income, disabled and working-class residents of those services across Kansas.

HEALTHCARE NAVIGATION PROGRAM FOR SPANISH SPEAKING FAMILIES

\$25,000

Combine community health worker and assister models to increase likelihood of sustainability and significantly expand access to a myriad of local and federal assistance programs for low-income Spanish speaking families in Wyandotte and Johnson Counties.

HEARTSPRING FRESH & HEALTHY **FOODS PROJECT**

\$25,000

Establish a healthy living foods program to increase access to and intake of fresh and healthy nutritional foods for children served by Heartspring Residential and Day School in South Central, KS.

Hire a caretaker for a tribal community garden and green house to assist in the implementation of a volunteer gardening program for children while ensuring sustainability and access to fresh fruits and vegetables year-round for the tribal community.

Implement a population health module to improve data analytics capabilities and increase access to quality care by screening and addressing social determinants of health that impact the medically underserved populations of Geary County and surrounding areas.

Contract feasibility study, leadership training, and strategic planning expertise to lead and facilitate community change around food production, distribution and access and develop programming guide for low-income consumers, refugee farmers and local food pantries.





HOSPICE UNIVERSITY \$17,850

Provide intensive training to hospice providers to improve organizational processes and efficiency to increase access to quality care for residents within four targeted regions: Southeast, South Central, Northeast and North Central, KS.

INCREASING HISPANIC PROGRAM PARTICIPATION THROUGH TARGETED OUTREACH

\$14,600
